Christmas Tree Chain Links

Instructions:

1. Cut paper of your choice into uniform and equal strips of paper.
2. Once you have cut out at least 20, you can roll one strip into a circle, stapling or gluing the ends together so it is secure.
3. Then, take another strip of paper and roll it into a circle, interlinking it with the first circle. Once the second one has been secured, the two chainlinks will be connected through the hole part of the circle, not actually glued flat together.
4. Continue this process until you have the length you wish for your chain link decoration.
5. Use it to decorate a Christmas tree, window, wall decor, or any other spot around your home or workplace that needs a little Christmas cheer.

Materials Needed

- 20-60 strips of paper that are approximately 17 cm by 2-3 cm wide. Each strip must be the same length and width.
- stapler, glue or tape

*This activity works best with a paper cutter, however it can be done with scissors.

Visual Instructions Christmas Chainlinks
